NORWAYNE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT **BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION 2020-108**

The Board of Education of the Norwayne Local School District, Wayne County, Ohio, met in regular session this 21st day of December, 2020, with the following members present:

Doug Ingold Angie Smith Winston Wyckoff III

Jon Widmer Earl Rupp

Mr. Widmer moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, Substitute House Bill 404 was passed by the Ohio legislature and signed by Governor Mike DeWine on November 22, 2020, effective immediately, as an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, in order to continue essential operation of various facets of state and local government and respond to the declared pandemic and global health emergency related to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, HB 404 extends some of the provisions of Am. Sub. HB 197 and HB 164, which addressed some of the implications of the COVID-19 pandemic on public schools; and

WHEREAS, Uncodified Section 12 of HB 404 permits public school boards to continue to conduct meetings and attend hearings by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology until July 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, with respect to teacher evaluations, Uncodified Section 10 of HB 404 prohibits the use of value-added progress dimension data, established under section 3302.021 of the Revised Code, any other metric used to evaluate positive student outcomes as described under section 3319.113 of the Revised Code, or any other student academic growth data to measure student learning attributable to a teacher or school counselor while conducting performance evaluations under sections 3319.02, 3319.111, and 3319.112, and 3319.113 of the Revised Code for the 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 school year; and

WHEREAS, Uncodified Section 11 of HB 404 permits the Governing Authority to choose to complete the performance evaluation of a principal for the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school years under R.C. 3319.02 without a student growth measure as part of the evaluation; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Uncodified Section 13 of HB 404, where the Governing Authority has not completed an evaluation that was required under Chapter 3319 of the Revised Code for the 2020-2021 school year prior to the effective date of HB 404 for an employee of the District, including a teacher, counselor, administrator, or chief administrator, the Governing Authority may elect not to conduct an evaluation of the employee for that school year, if the Governing Authority determines it would be impossible or impracticable to do so; and

WHEREAS, Uncodified Section 10 of HB 404 provides that where Governing Authority elects not to evaluate an employee for the 2019-2020 school year, the employee shall be considered not to have had evaluation procedures complied with pursuant to section 3319.111 of the Revised Code for purposes of section 3319.11 of the Revised Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Policy No. 1510 Public Meetings and Notification is temporarily amended until July 1, 2021, to allow the Governing Authority to hold and attend meetings and conduct hearings by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology, if all of the following apply:

- 1. Any resolution, rule, or formal action of any kind shall have the same effect as if it had occurred during an open meeting or hearing of the public body.
- 2. Notwithstanding R.C. 121.22(C), governing authority members attend meetings or hearings by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology, shall be considered present as if in person at the meeting or hearing, shall be permitted to vote, and shall be counted for purposes of determining whether a quorum is present the meeting or hearing;
- 3. The Governing Authority shall provide notification of meetings and hearings held to the public, to the media that have requested notification of a meeting, and to the parties required to be notified of a hearing, at least twenty-four hours in advance of the meeting or hearing by reasonable methods by which any person may determine the time, location, and the manner by which the meeting or hearing will be conducted, except in the event of an

emergency requiring immediate official action. In the event of an emergency, the Governing Authority shall immediately notify the news media that have requested notification, or the parties required to be notified of a hearing of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting or hearing.

- 4. The Governing Authority shall provide the public access to a meeting held under the temporarily amended policy, and to any hearing held under the temporarily amended policy that the public would otherwise be entitled to attend, commensurate with the method in which the meeting or hearing is being conducted, including, but not limited to, examples such as live-streaming by means of the internet, local radio, television, cable, or public access channels, call in information for a teleconference, or by means of any other similar electronic technology. Furthermore, the Governing Authority shall ensure that the public can observe and hear the discussions and deliberations of all the members of the public body, whether the member is participating in person or electronically.
- 5. When members of the Governing Authority conduct a hearing by means of teleconference, video conference, or any other similar electronic technology, the Governing Authority shall establish a means, through the use of electronic equipment that is widely available to the general public, to converse with witnesses, and to receive documentary testimony and physical evidence.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Policy No. 5640, Teacher Evaluations, shall be temporarily amended to prohibit the use of value-added progress dimension data, established under section 3302.021 of the Revised Code, from the 2020-2021 school year to measure student learning attributable to the teacher or counselor being evaluated, and further temporarily amended to permit the Governing Authority to disregard evaluation procedures and consequences if the Governing Authority determines not to evaluate a teacher, counselor, administrator, or chief administrator for the 2020-2021 school year because it would be impossible or impracticable to do so.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is hereby found and determined that all formal action of this Board concerning and/or relating to the adoption of this Resolution was taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- C. Transportation & Safety Committee Chairperson, Winston Wyckoff, III
 - 1. The goal of the Norwayne School District is to provide each child with a full day of school instruction and related activity for each day of the adopted school calendar. This goal is based on the assumption that weather and road conditions are not hazardous.

Wooster radio, WQKT 104.5 FM and WKVX 960 AM, will broadcast school delay or closing information by 6:00 a.m. Cancellations will also be reported to WQMX 94.9 FM, WONE 97.3 FM, WNCO 101.3 FM, WAKR 1590 AM and Cleveland TV stations, Channels 3, 5, 8 and 19. If conditions indicate that a delay will permit school to open (fog, ice, etc.) bus runs may be delayed for one or two hours. If conditions do not improve during the delay, schools may be dismissed for the day. Please stay tuned to the radio/TV.
